Augustiner brewery – The history of Augustiner-Bräu, due to about 680 years of tradition Munich's oldest brewery, began in 1294, when the cornerstone of the Augustinian monastery was laid. In the course of history, Augustiner-Bräu survived a privatization, some wars and many extensions without ever forgetting its philosophy or risking about the quality of its beer.

Freising – One of the oldest settlements in Bavaria. The town was gaining importance by becoming a major religious center in the early Middle Ages. In 1977, Pope Benedict XVI, then Joseph Ratzinger, was appointed Archbishop of Munich and Freising. But Freising is also known for the Hofbrauhaus brewery and the Weihenstephan brewery, the oldest brewery in the world, founded in 1040.

Hofbräuhaus – Wilhelm V., Duke of Bavaria had a thirsty and demanding royal household, who was dissatisfied with the beer brewed in Munich. As a result, beer had to be imported to Munich from Lower Saxony. Wilhelm ordered his royal court to come up with a way to reconcile cost and pleasure. In 1589, the council members approached him with an idea: why not build their own brewery? That same day, Wilhelm recruited the master brewer of the Geisenfeld Monastery, Heimeran Pongraz, to be the planner, developer and the Hofbräuhaus' master brewer.

Bad Tölz – Known for its spas, historic medieval town, and spectacular views of the Alps. On the western bank of the Isar River lies a spa whose iodine-rich waters are known for their healing powers. An excellent example of German late-Gothic architecture is the Stadtpfarrkirche, a church built in 1466. The distillery Schwaighofer was founded in 1890 and since then offers exquisite liqueurs, e.g. gingerbread liqueur.
