From Munich's English Garden to Hannover's Royal Gardens, enjoy a festive and relaxing atmosphere for three Euros or less.

In Europe, low cost airlines are taking off, so to speak, and Germany is no exception. It is trendy now to go city hopping on low cost airlines and it is a wonderful way to experience the diversity of Germany's cities. Travelers are using * German Wings and * Hapag-Lloyd Express as well as * Deutsche BA, * Germania, * AirBerlin, * Condor Airlines and * HapagFly.

To celebrate World Cup's 12 host cities, Lufthansa, the national airline, is adding a new twist to its international flights with a FGloBall Airpass. For as little as 60 Euros per flight, travelers can choose to purchase between 3 and 10 flight segments. The GloBall Airpass must be purchased in conjunction with an international/intercontinental ticket to Germany.

Of course, you can always use the superb German railway as that is a fast and efficient way of traveling around Germany. Rail Europe has specials for the World Cup and often offers 2 for 1 deals at various times of the year and special rates for seniors.

Welcome Cards are usually the cheapest and simplest way of getting to know a city. You can choose the length of a card's validity as well as the number of people using it. In addition to public transportation, many cities offer additional discounts for sightseeing tours, guided walks, and shopping. You can find them in all tourist information bureaus in town and city centers and train stations. Prices vary from 7,50 Euros for a single day to 38 Euros for a three day family card. Feature: Royal Overnights for 100 Euros or Less

In northern Bavaria, for starters, there is **Castle Colmberg**, which lies halfway between Ansbach and Rothenburg ob der Tauber in the area called Franconian Switzerland. The rooms start at 75 Euros per night and the castle kitchen and wine cellar offer Franconian delicacies and wines. ** www.burg-colmberg.de

In the state of Baden Wuerttemberg, not far from Heidelberg, stands **Castle Hornberg**, an 11th-century knight's castle, high above the River Neckar. Enjoy authentic and unmistakable charm of former centuries. Rooms go for 100 Euros per night. * www.burg-hotel-hornberg.de

Cinderella's castle on the Fairy Tale Road in Hessen, **Castle Sababurg**, was made famous by the Grimm Brothers but today, the castle hotel has a wedding chapel, a theater, palace ruins as well as a romantic castle garden. In the northern state of Mecklenburg Vorpommern, in the beautiful and unknown Mecklenburg Lake District is **Castle Hotel Grossplasten**, an elegant hotel and spa built originally in 1751. Prices start at 45 Euros per person. The nearby **Klink Castle** has over 108 rooms and suites, a
