Farm stays in the beautiful Starnberg Five Lake Region only ninety minutes south of Munich are a fantastic and cost-effective way for a family vacation. Visitors can experience Bavaria's traditions, local life and beautiful landscapes first hand. The region is a popular destination for waterskiing, surfing and sailing. A boat cruise on Lake Starnberg or on Lake Ammer is a special way to experience the beauty of the region. The cruises pass historic locations set against an unspoiled mountain landscape. Garmisch Partenkirchen is a year around climatic health resort and famous Alpine winter sports center in a stunning setting at the foot of the Zugspitze, Germany's highest mountain. Excursions over the high plateau provide a suitable challenge for mountain sports enthusiasts. There are plenty of well-maintained footpaths suitable for everyone, even for wheelchair users. Close to Chiemsee, the town of Ruhpolding offers a great variety of activities for the entire family within the beautiful mountain scenery for affordable prices. A highlight is climbing the summit of the Rauschberg with its breathtaking view and then riding the mountain lift back down. Families (2 adults, 2 children) can stay with the "Peak of Summer"-deal for 14 nights in an apartment for only 888 Euro. Neww.ruhpolding.de

Berchtesgaden National Park is one of the oldest nature reserves in the Alps. It offers visitors the opportunity to experience an enchanting and relatively unknown part of the Alps. Guided or independent walks in the national park are excellent ways to discover this wild resort. A historic viewpoint high above the Berchtesgaden area with panoramic views of up to 200 kilometers is the "Eagles Nest", Adolf Hitler's former representational residence. In the Documentation Center Obersalzberg, Hitler's former summer getaway, the visitor can see an exhibition about the Nazi regime and its rule. The road from Obersalzberg to the Eagle's Nest is a unique feat of engineering seen nowhere else in the world and a breathtaking ride.

For visitors interested in regional crafts, the Glass Road offers great activities. The route begins in Europe's "lead crystal capital" Neustadt, close to Bayreuth and the Czech border, and runs south for approximately 250 kilometers to the Passau Glass Museum where over 15,000 examples of centuries old glassware can be discovered.
