Beautiful woodlands and romantic valleys, magnificent castles and monasteries, vibrant cities and enchanting towns - that's the state of Baden-Wuerttemberg. The Black Forest and Lake Constance region are already famous far beyond Germany's borders for their beautiful landscapes. But one of the most impressive things about Baden-Wuerttemberg is its richness in culture and traditions. It looks back on a long and eventful history which has contributed a great deal to the state's cultural diversity. Baden-Wuerttemberg, which stretches from the Lake Constance in the South to the river Main in the North, is home to the famous cuckoo clocks, the Black Forest gateau, the traditional Bollenhut and many other handicrafts.

Ever since 1667 or thereabouts, when the first wooden clock was made in the Black Forest region, clock making has seen many fascinating developments. The famous cuckoo clock was invented here, and they, as well as many high-tech clocks, are still handcrafted in the area. Visitors to Baden-Wuerttemberg can follow the German Clock Route, which runs through the many of the most attractive and scenic parts of the Black Forest holiday region. The route features fascinating museums and attractions of clock-making tradition such as small workshops and clock-face painting studios. One of the highlights en route is the world's largest cuckoo clock in Schonach housing a 331 pound cuckoo.

Another hallmark of Baden-Wuerttemberg is the Bollenhut, the traditional hat with large red or black pompoms. The Bollenhut is a country hat for women to be worn on holidays in the three neighboring Black Forest towns of Gutach, Kirnbach and Reichenbach. It was created around 1750 - originally with red or black circles, which were painted on a white straw hat. The color of the hat's pompoms is significant: red indicates that the lady wearing the hat is unmarried; black is worn by married women. Over the years it was developed into the eight or eleven woolen pompons altogether weighing about 4.5 pounds. Today the hats are still made by skilled seamstresses and milliners and the tradition is vital and alive. The Bollenhut and many other unusual hat creations are on display in the Black Forest Traditional Costume Museum in Haslach. www.haslach.de (German only) and in the Black Forest Museum in Triberg.

On the way through Baden-Wuerttemberg, visitors should make sure to sample the delicious local specialties such as fine wines, hearty rye bread baked over wood, Black Forest ham, the genuine Black Forest cake complete with cherries and the wonderful fruit schnapps. With over 14,000 distillers, the Black Forest has the highest distillery density in the world. Oberkirch, close to Offenburg, is the centre of German fruit spirit distilleries, where almost 900 small and tiny distilleries are located. The small town even houses a schnapps academy where graduates receive a "Wässerli-Diplom" (Schnapps Diploma). \*\*www.blackforest-tourism.com

In the spring time the Easter egg markets are not to be missed. From late March to early April throughout Baden-Wuerttemberg, there are many beautiful Easter egg markets and exhibitions where local craftsmen display their decorated eggs. Often other traditional Easter goodies are on sale as well such as baskets, arts and crafts and bunnies. Some of the most well-known festivals are the Easter market in Castle Schwetzingen near Heidelberg >www.schwetzingen.de (German only) and the Easter egg exhibition in Sonnenbühl > www.sonnenbuehl.de (German only).

# Luther's birth house reopens, Eisleben

Mar 09 Martin Luther's birth house is reopening for visitors after half a year of renovations. The historic building which was awarded UNESCO world heritage status has undergone extensive restorations. Added to the building has been a connection to the neighboring free school for poor, which extends the exhibition area to a total of 13 rooms. The Imhoff-Stollwerk Chocolate Museum in Cologne takes gourmands on a journey through 3,000 years of chocolate-making history. Chocolate lovers will learn about the secrets of chocolate, about the worship of cocoa by natives of Central America and about modern-day chocolate production. North of Frankfurt, in the open-air museum Hessenpark, visitors of all ages can explore 400 years of German living culture and traditions. Over 100 buildings, from farmsteads and laborer houses to a school and a post office, have been removed from their original sites in villages all over Hessen and reconstructed on 160 acres. The Museum is organized into five groups of buildings, according to the regions they have been relocated from and give visitors an idea of what rural life was like before.

The German Toy Museum in Nuremberg is where the heart of the toy world beats. Steam engines, dolls and Lego remind adults of their childhood, while today's children admire the space station and discover toys from Africa and Asia. The museum presents the many facets of the plaything from antiquity to the present day, focusing on wooden toys, exquisite dolls' parlors and kitchens and a "world of tin".
